Owned and operated by Children's Health Foundation, Qwalayu House is located at [565 2nd Avenue](#) on the North Island Hospital – Campbell River campus, behind Yucalta Lodge. The home has 10 bedrooms, a large kitchen, dining, living, quiet rooms, and playrooms; and a backyard where kids can feel at home.

Responsibilities

- Work with staff and other volunteers to carry out yard work such as weeding, maintenance of garden beds, and watering.

- Reliable and committed.
- Able to work both independently and as part of a team.
- Some basic knowledge of gardening principles (but not a requirement)

- Time commitment can be as little as a one time experience or regular weekly, bi-weekly or monthly shifts!
