

Bear Essentials

Program summary

Bear Essentials is a family support program offered by Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island (CHFVI) that assists with the costs of health-related travel and equipment for Island kids and is intended to fill the gaps that exist in public funding. The program is designed for families with significant financial need that struggle to afford the associated costs, or that have barriers limiting their ability to access health care or equipment for their child. The Bear Essentials Program is funded by the generous support of CHFVI donors.

Children/youth must meet all the following criteria:

- ✓ 0 to 19 years old (up to 20th birthday),
- ✓ live on Vancouver Island or the surrounding islands,
- ✓ have a medical condition, health challenge, or disability confirmed by a health care professional,
- ✓ require financial support to cover the cost of the item(s) in the application, and
- ✓ have not exceeded the lifetime Bear Essentials maximum of \$12,500.

Bear Essentials is a program accessed through referral only. A health care professional familiar with the applicant's needs and family circumstances should complete the online application with the consent of the applicant's parent or primary guardian.

Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island prioritizes applications from referring health professionals working within public systems like health authorities, school districts, and community organizations. Examples of health professionals include but are not limited to the following:

- audiologists
- behaviour consultants
- counsellors
- dieticians
- infant development consultants

- nurses
- occupational therapists
- orthotists
- physicians
- physiotherapists

- program navigators (on behalf of a health professional)
- social workers
- speech language pathologists

Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island encourages families to access available public resources to complement Bear Essentials funding. The program is intended to fill gaps through a low-barrier, supportive, and dignified application process.

General guidelines

- Bear Essentials provides funds to support future costs of health-related travel and equipment. The program
 does not reimburse expenses incurred before an application was approved. In case of emergency travel,
 special consideration may be available.
- Health professionals may apply on behalf of families for both travel and equipment on one application.
- If there are multiple children in a family who require Bear Essentials support, a separate application is required for each child.
- Children may have more than one application submitted on their behalf during their lifetime and may be eligible for up to \$12,500 in cumulative funding.
- All applications will be reviewed in consideration of the available program funding at the time of submission.
- If any parts of the application require further attention or information, a Program Navigator will contact the health professional and reach out to the family if appropriate.
- For travel funding, a document confirming appointments/treatments is required and should be uploaded through the online system. Documentation can also be sent later by email but may result in the application taking longer to process.
- Travel funding is intended to support one caregiver who is traveling with the child.
- Consent by the parent/guardian should accompany each application and may be provided by verbal confirmation, or the form can be printed, signed, and uploaded with the online application. Refer to Appendix C.
- Use of equipment loan libraries are encouraged for short term equipment use or to trial equipment prior to purchase.
- Funding will be paid to the vendor when equipment is approved. The family, or the health professional acting on their behalf orders the equipment. Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island is responsible for closing the transaction by paying the vendor.
- Travel allowance will be paid directly to the family, preferably by direct deposit.
- Applications will be reviewed as quickly as possible; however, the program is not set up to handle urgent requests where the funds are required immediately.
- Approved funds expire if not used within 1 month for travel and 3 months for equipment from the approval date and a new application will need to be submitted.

Bear Essentials does not fund dental work, medication, consumables, safety equipment, and services such
as therapies and those related to service animals. Also not funded are administrative costs to complete the
application, and labour or repair costs of equipment.

When a family's needs do not fit the Bear Essentials criteria, we are committed to offering navigation to relevant resources and supports. To explore navigation support, a referring professional can connect with a Program Navigator.

What we fund

Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island's Bear Essentials program is focused on health-related travel and equipment.

Health-related travel

Health professionals apply on behalf of families for funding to support travel within British Columbia when a child requires health care outside of their home community. Confirmed appointments and/or treatment within 30 days of the application date are acceptable.

Approved applicants will be provided with travel funding based on a calculation that accounts for the departure location, the intended destination, and the estimated duration of stay (Appendix D). The calculation accounts for round trips for the child and one caregiver. Approved travel allowance is provided directly to the family shortly before their departure date and can be used to assist with costs such as gas, parking, meals, and incidentals.

Bear Essentials funding isn't intended to cover the full cost families incur related to medical travel for their children. Families are expected to use the province's Travel Assistance Program for BC Ferries when eligibility requirements fit.

The following guidelines are specific to health-related travel:

- For families to receive funding prior to their travel, a completed application must be received a minimum of 10 business days to guarantee funding on time.
- Prenatal relocation for birth support is funded a weekly travel allowance and calculated as part of the child's lifetime summary of Bear Essentials funds.
- Travel support for regular, routine healthcare appointments such as dentistry, optometry, vaccinations or prenatal screening (e.g., ultrasounds) will not be considered.
- For long-term medical stays, Bear Essentials will set up weekly or bi-weekly payments and request monthly check-ins with the referring professional.
- When travel is required out of province for a medical need unavailable within BC, applications will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Health related accommodation

- Health related accommodation is only considered when traveling further than 45 kms and requiring multiday appointments.
- Families are encouraged to use subsidized home away from home resources of the Children's Health Foundation when available. The room rate at Jeneece Place and Qwalayu House is \$26.25 per night for families (includes GST); CHFVI subsidizes the remaining nightly cost. Families are encouraged to pay when possible.
- In Vancouver, families are encouraged to use subsidized accommodation (e.g. Ronald McDonald House), when available.
- When subsidized accommodation is not available to families, partial accommodation support can be applied
 for. Once approved, please request a medical rate at the time of booking and email the booking
 confirmation to the Program Navigators for accommodation allowance. Contact a Program Navigator for a
 list of affordable hotel options if needed.

Health-related equipment

Health care professionals may apply on behalf of families for funding to support the purchase of health-related equipment. Families are encouraged to pursue the most cost-effective option that best meets the child/youth's health needs. Approved equipment expenses are typically paid directly to the vendor. Local and/or Canadian vendors are preferred.

Types of eligible equipment include, but are not limited to:

- Medical equipment such as hearing aids, orthotics, or wheelchairs
- Adaptive equipment such as specialized seating or a standing frame
- Assistive technology hardware and software such as an iPad with special communication software for a nonverbal child. There is a requirement that the equipment has been successfully trialed prior to submitting a Bear Essentials application.

Complementary funding

The Bear Essentials program is intended to fill the gaps that exist within current health care programs. When public funding sources are not available, or only partially available for a child, Bear Essentials welcomes applications to fund the identified gap. Bear Essentials may consider co-funding alongside other funders for families experiencing high financial stress.

Bear Essentials funding isn't intended to cover the full cost families incur related to medical travel for their children.

It is expected that families and referring professionals will source complementary funding for costly medical equipment. If complementary funding is not available, Bear Essentials may need to cap funding based on available funds at the time of the application.

Please refer to Appendix B for a list of available funding sources.

How to apply

1. Assess need and program fit

- Identify need for health-related travel or equipment support.
- Consider available public resources to address needs (Appendix B) and whether Bear Essentials is a fit.
- Introduce Bear Essentials to the family. Bear Essentials is a donor funded program of the Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island and aims to provide financial support to families most in need.
- Receive verbal permission or written consent from the family to proceed with an application.

2. Gather information

For privacy reasons, the online system does not have the ability to store information. Applications need to be completed in full at one time. Closing the online application prior to submitting will result in loss of data so it is recommended that all necessary information is gathered and accessible prior to starting an application.

- Work with the family to acquire the necessary information for a successful application (Appendix A). This may include connecting with equipment vendors for quotes/estimates, supporting the family to plan their health-related travel, helping the family get an appointment/treatment schedule, and gaining an understanding of funding confirmed from other sources.
- Connect with the Program Navigators as needed. Their role is to help you help families and to facilitate successful applications. Please reach out!

3. Complete online form and submit required documents

- Health professionals can access the online application <u>here</u> and reach out to a Program Navigator for the password.
- Incomplete or unclear forms will result in delayed processing.
- Upload required documents through the online system or send shortly after by email.

4. Application status

- You will receive an email confirming that the application was received. Please contact us if you don't receive confirmation immediately.
- All applications will be reviewed to determine suitability, and to prioritize need alongside available funding.
- If any parts of the application require further attention or information, a Program Navigator will contact the referring professional and reach out to the family when appropriate.
- Equipment applications will be reviewed on a weekly basis and may be deferred based on available funds.
- Final granting decisions will be communicated as quickly as possible to the health professional and the family.

5. Support family with acquisition

- The family or the referring professional is responsible for ordering most equipment or booking accommodation. A Program Navigator will close the transaction by paying the vendor.
- If travel funding is approved, a Program Navigator will request banking information and arrange payment to the family.
- Bear Essentials will follow up with a short survey that will be emailed to the family. Participation in the survey is optional, but it is appreciated to help assess and strengthen the Program.

Privacy commitment

As a registered charity, Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island (CHFVI) collects personal information under the authority of the Personal Information Protection Act (PIPA). Personal information (Appendix A) collected through an application to the Bear Essentials program will be used for the purpose of evaluating a family's eligibility to receive a grant, to coordinate disbursal of the funds, and to help the family access other relevant support programs.

Non-identifying information gathered from the application may be used on an aggregate basis for understanding need, reporting trends, demonstrating impact, and improving services.

Information in this application will be reviewed in confidence by CHFVI staff. CHFVI staff at Jeneece Place and \dot{Q} walayu House may be consulted to determine occupancy options for families. All personal information will be used only as specified and stored securely.

Appendix B - Complementary funding and support

The Bear Essentials program is intended to fill the gaps that exist with current health care programs. If the following funding sources are not available, or only partially available for a child, Bear Essentials welcomes applications to fund the identified gap.

1. An extended health benefits plan through place of employment or privately purchased

2. Ministry of Children and Families

<u>Autism Funding</u> - funding for autism intervention services and therapies. <u>At Home Program</u> - support children and teens with a severe disability or complex health care needs.

3. Ministry of Social Development & Poverty Reduction

<u>Healthy Kids Program</u> - basic optical care, hearing assistance, and dental treatment for children in low-income families.

4. Ministry of Health

<u>Pharmacare</u> - helps BC residents with the cost of certain medical supplies as well as pharmaceuticals. <u>Travel Assistance Program</u> - helps alleviate some of the transportation costs for eligible BC residents who must travel within the province for non-emergency medical specialist services. <u>BC Family Residence Program</u> - accommodation assistance to enable families to stay together when their child requires medical care at BC Children's Hospital or Sunny Hill Health Centre.

5. First Nations Health Authority

<u>Medical supplies and equipment</u> - medical equipment and supplies for personal use. <u>Mental Health Benefit</u> - counselling services from a qualified mental health provider. <u>Vision care</u> - covers eye exams and eyeglasses.

<u>Pharmacy</u> - prescription drugs, over the counter drugs, and compounds. <u>Dental</u> - covers eligible dental treatments.

Medical Travel – supports travel costs for medical related travel.

6. Government of Canada

<u>Jordan's Principle</u> - supports First Nations children to access products, services, and supports they need. It can help with a wide range of health, social, and educational needs and medical travel funding is available. <u>The Jordan's Principle Hub for BC</u> is also a helpful resource.

<u>Canada Dental Benefit</u> – intended to help lower dental costs for eligible families.

7. Métis Nation of BC

<u>Métis Family Connections</u> – focused on helping families build a network of support <u>Miyoopimatishihk (Wellbeing) Program</u> – financial support to assist with the costs of a wide range of services, programs and products.

8. Canadian Cancer Society

<u>Cancer Travel and Accommodation Services</u> - dedicated to reducing the financial burden associated with travelling for cancer treatment across the province.

This is not an exhaustive list of complementary funding sources.
